His Rap fans as "John J.G." and to people who knew his boxing career, they respectfully called him "Champ". Jonathan worked very hard on conditioning and taken care of his body. He met Mike Tyson to talk with him about his boxing career, had scheduled fights for the Golden Gloves, planned to go to Vegas this month to see his sisters that lived there and to talk with Floyd Merriweather's staff.

Jonathan, graduated class of 2001 from John F. Kennedy High School making both of his parents and family proud. The same year they were even more proud when he emlisted into the United States Marine Corps. After, leaving, the Marines where he also boxed, he attended Lakeland University where he studied his prerequisite. Jonathan had one son, Jayzon McNeil ,who preceded him in death. He was born on October 29 2005 and died less than one month later on Thanksgiving day, was by Jonathan's ex girlfriend and long time lifetime friend, Samantha Hunter. Jonathan's male best friend is Monroe Mickles as they grew up on the same street from childhood.
