Obituary

Andrewetta “Candy” (nee Thomas) Stone, was born on Valentine’s day on February 14, 1951, to the union of Andrew Thomas and Ruth (nee Satterfield) Thomas (both deceased). Candy, as she was affectionately known to most, had a beloved younger brother Steven “Stevie” Thomas (deceased), who was also born to that union. As a young adult, he died in a tragic accident and she grieved his loss for a long time.

Candy accepted Christ as her Savior at an early age. She graduated from Hoban Dominican High School for girls and even as a child, she was always known for her bright eyes, mischievous smile, high-spirited and sassy ways with her classic comedic timing.

During her young adulthood, Candy spent many years living in Los Angeles, California, working, playing, and spending time with her cousin, Francis and his wife, Patricia Manning and their children, Diane Brooks (deceased), Ray Manning, Tony Manning, Cheryl “Sherry” Tinson, Patricia “Patty” Manning, Chris Muhammad and another close cousin, William “Bill” Satterfield, who had moved out west prior to her arrival. They all became like her brothers and sisters and not just cousins. While in California, she was able to work as a House Manager through an agency that provided private skilled workers for movie stars and Hollywood elites such as, Renee Taylor, who was a comedy writer for Redd Foxx and Lucille Ball. She excelled as a cook everywhere she went. She got the job due to a masterful letter of reference that her aunt, Vivian Virden, had written as if Candy had worked for her and in a way she did. Candy might as well have been known as the Smith family cook and comedian. She was always asked and would often volunteer to cook for every family function that was on the calendar. Candy was always ready to party, joke and celebrate. She hosted many backyard barbeques, card parties and she even held a memorial service for her two favorite singers: Prince and B.B. King, in her “Purple Palace”, aka her basement.

Over the years, Candy held many jobs: caterer, baker/cake decorator, truck driver with the handle, “Lady Brickhouse”, the big/rig long haul truck driver, traveler, Disneyland Myrtle Beach bum and our family’s pantry manager, who made sure that even the most wayward family members had something good and nutritious to eat. However, her greatest job came later in life as a mother and grandmother.

In her mid 30s, Candy took on the role of adding, LaVelle, Tiffany and Stevie to her family. She raised them and cared for them, to the best of her ability, with the help of her beloved mother, Ruth Thomas in their inter-generational family home until her mother’s passing only a few years ago

Candy found out too late that she was gravely ill and although her body succumbed, to her illness, her loving spirit remains and will be mourned by her children, LaVelle, Tiffany and Steven, her grandchildren; Jade, Aubree (deceased) Kaylee and Kingston, her close and dear friend, Christopher Boyd. And a host of cousins, family and friends.

She was blessed to live a pretty adventurous fun-filled life and will be dearly missed by all who were afforded the chance to be entertained by the Hostess formerly known as “Candy Stone.”
