## **Obituary**

The blessing of a beautiful voice led him to join two citywide faith-based Historical Black Choirs, **"The Heritage Coral"** and the **"Ecumenical Disciples"** under the direction of Gerald Bennett Harris and wife, Lannette Harris, both deceased. In 2016, Darrell became **Director** of the Ecumenical Disciples.

On Monday April 25, 2022, Darrell and Vivian celebrated 30 years of marital bliss. On Monday, November 7, 2022, at approximately 8:30 p.m. Darrell went home to be with the Lord.
