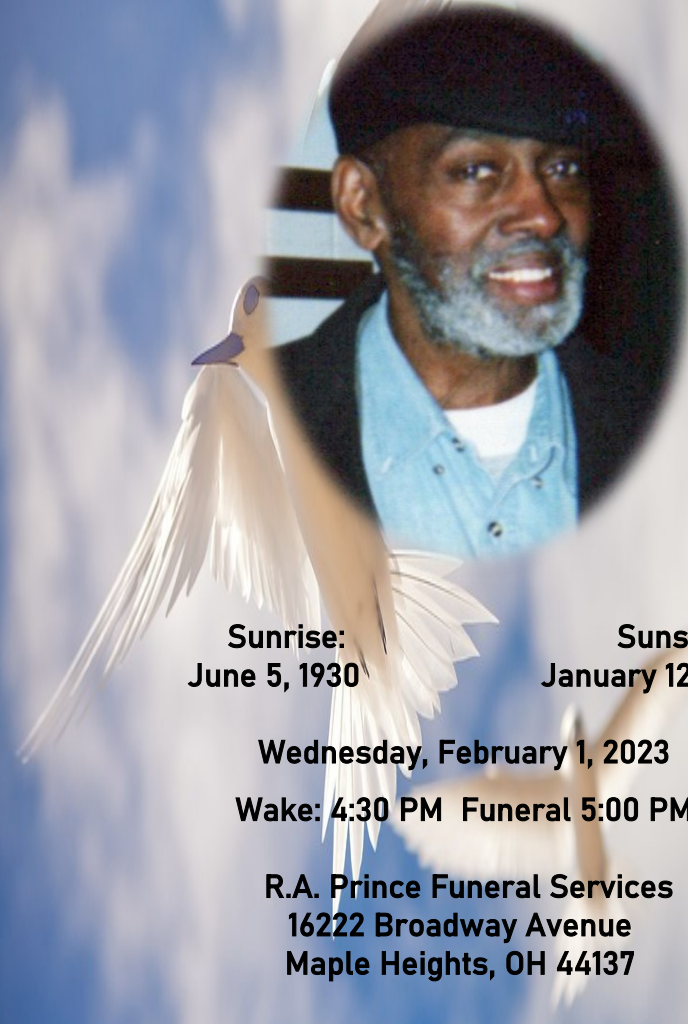

Obituary

Robert Johnson Jr., affectionately known as, “Big Pappa”, was born on June 5, 1930 in Tallassee, Alabama. He was the fifth child born to Robert and Rosalee Johnson.

He attended the Tallassee School system up to the eight grade. Regretfully having to withdraw from school to help support the family in 1945, a decision was made to move to Cleveland, Ohio for a better opportunity to support the family. After settling in Cleveland on 38th Street, Robert found God at Gladstone Baptist Church at an early age, under the teaching of Rev. W. D. Lowe Sr., and became a part of the (G.B.C.) family. He dedicated his life and service to worshipping the Lord. He took his, Deaconship seriously and accepted his responsibility joyfully. Shortly after, Robert’s sister Betty, introduced him to a young vibrant, good looking curly haired girl by the name of Deloias Terry, at the tender age of 16. He walked her home met her parents Daisy and Jessie Terry, after spending time talking to them all day , he knew he had to become part of the family. However, on March 18, 1958, they had their 1st girl, named by her grandmother, Robin Darcel . Two years later, arrived Vikki Lynnwood named after Robert’s brother-in-law, Lynnwood Odum. The ultimate surprised happened, on January 14, 1971! the sparkle happened, Robert Johnson III was born, named after the big man himself, “little badass”!!!!

Robert was always a hard worker, he worked at the U S Steel Mill for 36 years and worked for Celotex Corporation for 3 years. He and his lovely wife painted houses inside and out, he also loved to help people with their plumbing needs. He taught all of his nephews a way of life by having a skilled trade, which is still in effect today. Affectionately known to family members as uncle Bob, he enjoyed his family gatherings, spending time with his friends and acquaintances. He loved watching a good game like basketball and baseball. He was a true Cavs fan and loved watching the game with his son Roboo, grandsons, Jonathan and Nazier and his friend Mike, just to name a few and folks that loved to watch the game with him.

He loved all of his grandchildren, Enjolie’ “Reece”, (Jamal), Jonathan “John, John”, (Rikki), Dion “Lu Lu”, Khalil “Shaq” (Raven), and Nazier “Nas“. He leaves to cherish his precious memories his wife: Deloias, his three children, Robin (Sergent), Vikki “Ms Vik” (John), Robert “ Roboo” (Marcie) of Cleveland, Ohio, and a host of grandchildren, great-grandchildren, as well as nieces, nephews, other family members and friends as well as his grand-dog, Basil.
