Pauline accepted Christ at an early age. Sunday School and Church were always a part of her life. Pauline was educated in the Cleveland Public School System. A product of “Old Central High School.” She furthered her education in later years attending Cuyahoga Community College.

Pauline enjoyed the Lee Road Travel Group. Her retirement afforded her the opportunity to travel more. Her travels have taken her to Israel, Jerusalem - the Holy Land, the Vatican – Rome Italy, and four countries in Africa (Senegal, Gambia, the Republic of Côte d'Ivoire, and Ghana). She also traveled to the Southern Caribbean, Western Caribbean, Hawaii, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Canada, Monaco, France, Germany, Spain, and most parts of the United States.

Pauline took pictures in every place. Her camera was always handy and ready to use. Her family called her the “Mad Snapper.” Pauline quietly went home to be with Jesus on April 2, 2024.

Loving memories of her will be cherished by those she dearly loved. Her children and their spouses – Delores E. Tabb (Jackie Sr-deceased), Barbara J. Toney-deceased (John), and Dr. Robert L. 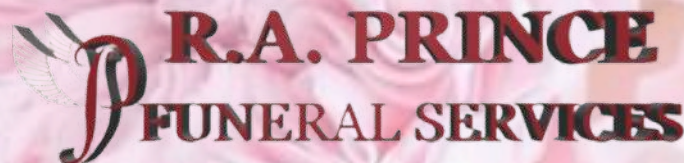
