Grover “Antwan” Holden, age 42, was born June 29, 1981, to Grover C. (deceased) and Osie Holden, in Cleveland, Ohio. He was the youngest of 11 children.

The Holden family attended Saint Thomas Aquinas Church prior to it merging with St. Agnes our Lady of Fatima Church. Here, “Groove”, as some knew him, played basketball, sang in the choir, and volunteered at the reception desk and at various church events.

Grover attended Saint Thomas Aquinas Elementary School and graduated from Villa Angela - Saint Joseph High School. There he met Erica Thompson, the mother of his 23 year old daughter, Arionne Holden. He briefly attended Cleveland State University. In 2002, Grover met his wife Cindy Holden, while working at K-mart. They dated for 10 years and were married in 2011. From this union came 13year old son, King Holden.

Taking after his father, Grover successfully pursued his long time career goal of becoming a certified Heating and Cooling Technician. He worked in the field for 3 and a half years. Prior to this, he managed Ben and Jerry’s and Bruegger's Bagels at Cleveland Hopkins Airport. Later he became a Sales Representative at Conrad’s Tire Express. He was devoted to excellent customer service, a quality that abounded from the character of his heart.

Grover never met any strangers, instead he treated everyone like family. He was a friend to many, but his most notable titles were Father and Husband. He maintained a close relationship with his family, especially his cousins, whom he often invited to his home for food, drinks, and fun on weekends and holidays.
